

The Single Action Shooting Society (SASS)



The Single Action Shooting Society is an international organization created to preserve and promote the sport of Cowboy Action Shooting™. SASS endorses regional matches conducted by affiliated clubs, stages END of TRAIL The World Championship of Cowboy Action Shooting, promulgates rules and procedures to ensure safety and consistency in Cowboy Action Shooting matches, and seeks to protect its members' 2nd Amendment rights. SASS members share a common interest in preserving the history of the Old West and competitive shooting.

One of the unique aspects of SASS approved Cowboy Action Shooting™ is the requirement placed on costuming. Each participant is required to adopt a shooting alias appropriate to a character or profession of the late 19th century, a Hollywood western star, or an appropriate character from fiction. Their costume is then developed accordingly. Many event participants gain more enjoyment from the costuming aspect of our sport than from the shooting competition, itself. Regardless of a SASS member's individual area of interest, SASS events provide regular opportunities for fellowship and fun with like-minded folks and families.

Every SASS member is required to select a shooting alias representative of a character or profession from the Old West or the western film genre. Your alias may not in anyway duplicate or easily be confused with any other member's alias

As the game of Cowboy Action Shooting™ has evolved, our members have developed and adopted an attitude towards their participation called "The Spirit of the Game." It is a code by which we live. Competing in "The Spirit of the Game" means you fully participate in what the competition asks. You try your best to dress the part, use the appropriate competition tools, and respect the traditions of the Old West. Some folks would call it nothing more than good sportsmanship. We call it "Spirit of the Game."

Address of Cavalier Rifle & Pistol Club:

**14151 Boondock Lane
Montpelier, Virginia, 23192**

From Interstate 64 West of Richmond, Virginia:

- Take exit 167 for VA-617 toward Oilville/Goochland
- Turn right/north onto State Route 617/Oilville Rd (0.6 mile)
- Turn left to stay on State Route 617/Oilville Rd
- Continue to follow State Route 617 (2.8 miles)
- Turn right onto State Route 611/Vontay Rd (0.5 mile)
- Turn left onto State Route 617/Spring Rd (2.3 miles)
- Turn left onto State Route 610/617/Taylor's Creek Rd
- Continue to follow State Route 610/617/Taylor's Creek Rd (1.5 mile)
- Turn left onto Boondock Lane
- Cavalier Rifle & Pistol Club Entrance 1 mile to Entrance/Gate
- After passing through the Gate, Keep Left at road split
- We shoot on Range 3, Look for the Cowboy Hats

From Fredericksburg, Virginia:

- Head south on I-95 S
- Take exit 92 to merge onto VA-54 W/E Patrick Henry Rd
- Continue to follow VA-54 W
- Continue onto US-33 W/Mountain Rd
- Turn left onto State Route 610/Bethany Church Rd
- Continue to follow State Route 610
- Turn left onto Boondock Lane
- Cavalier Rifle & Pistol Club Entrance 1 mile to Entrance/Gate
- After passing through the Gate, Keep Left at road split
- We shoot on Range 3, Look for the Cowboy Hats

The Cavalier Cowboys are a Cowboy Action Shooting Club based near Montpelier, Virginia. We are associated with the Cavalier Rifle & Pistol Club which is where we hold our matches. We shoot on the 1st Sunday and 2nd Wednesday of every month, with a few exceptions. The Cavalier Cowboys are a SASS (Single Action Shooting Society) Affiliated Club, we are governed by and operate our matches under all SASS Rules.

You do not have to be a member of either Cavalier Rifle & Pistol Club nor SASS to shoot with us, everyone is welcome to join us as our guests.

New shooters are welcome and encouraged!!

If you have ever wondered how much fun it would be to dress up like a cowboy and shoot 1800 era pistols, rifles and shotguns at steel targets then COME ON OUT and find out!!

The best way to learn about cowboy action shooting is to talk directly with the cowboys and cowboys love to talk about the sport of cowboy action shooting.



What's Needed to get Started in Cowboy Action Shooting...

BEFORE you purchase any firearm intended to be used in cowboy action shooting, we STRONGLY recommended that you come to a match and talk with the cowboys to find out what to purchase and what not to purchase.

The Cavalier Cowboys require all new shooters to observe a entire cowboy match before they can shoot their first match. The observation can take place at any cowboy club and is intended to familiarize the new shooter with the safety rules and to learn how a match is conducted.

First time shooters are assigned a "mentor" for their first match, an experienced shooter who will coach and guide them through the match.

All equipment, firearms, ammunition and clothing must be compliant with all SASS rules and regulations. Consult the shooter handbooks on www.sassnet.com for details but the following is a summary:

Equipment Needed:

- All firearms must be based off of those used in the 1800's cowboy era or from cowboy era movies.
- Pistol/Rifle ammunition must be centerfire, at least .32 cal. and no larger than .45 cal., with only solid lead bullets (no jacketed or platted bullets)
- Two single action revolvers, 5 or 6 shot capacity
- One lever action rifle, 10 shot capacity minimum, pistol caliber
- One shotgun either a model 1897 Winchester design or side by side double in 20 or 12 gauge
- Pistol belt with two holsters, one on each side
- Either a shotgun ammo belt or ammo slide that holds 6 to 12 shotgun rounds
- Cowboy Costume

A typical monthly cowboy match will consist of 6 stages and you will need 60 pistol rounds, 60 rifle rounds and 24 shotgun rounds at a minimum but always bring extra !!
